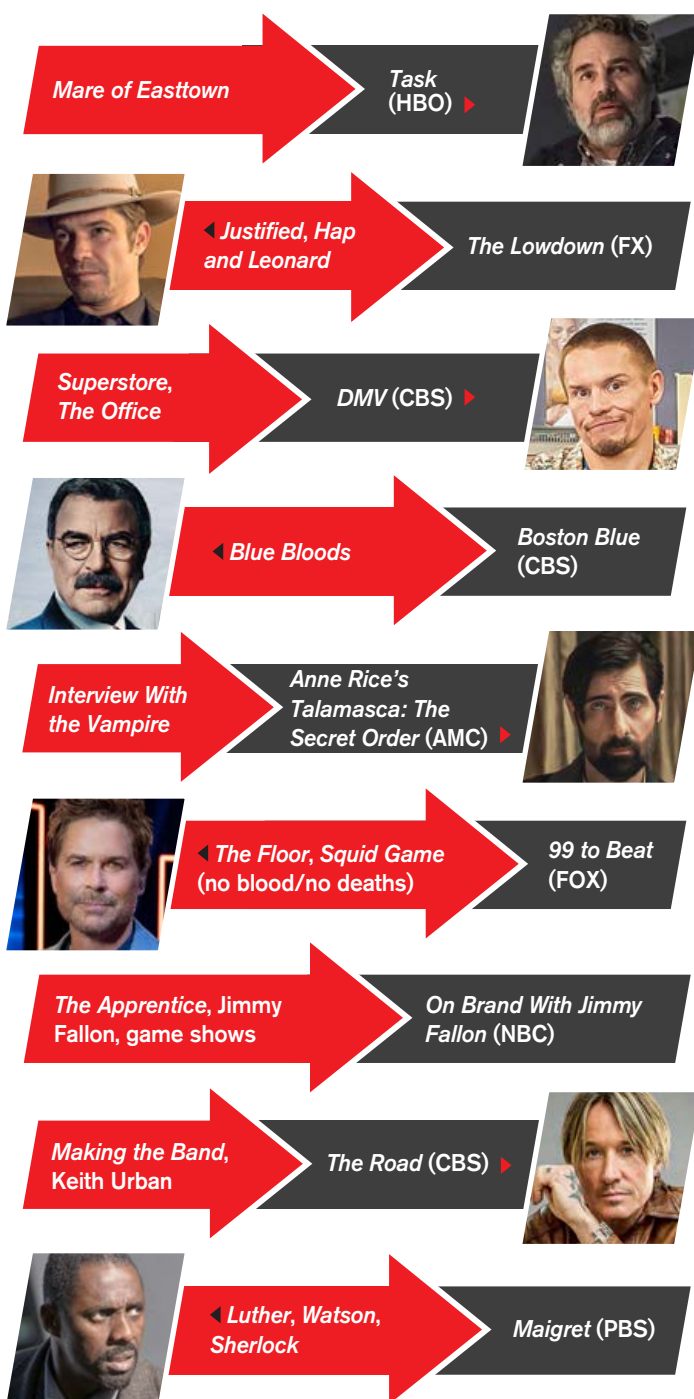

Emmy Awards Ceremony A Highlight Of Fall 2025 Specials

The start of a new fall season is most known for the premieres of new series and the returns of familiar favorites. That is certainly true this year, but there are also a number of one-shot specials, including high-profile awards ceremonies, to look forward to over the next couple of months.



77th Emmy Awards

■ Sunday, Sept. 14,
Live Coast to Coast

CBS

The centerpiece special this fall is the annual Emmy Awards ceremony, which honors television's (and streaming's) best. Comedian Nate Bargatze hosts this year's awards, whose field is led by Apple TV+'s *Severance* with 27 nominations. Just behind is HBO's *The Penguin*, with 24 nominations, followed by *The White Lotus* on HBO, and *The Studio* on Apple TV+, with 23 each. HBO and HBO Max lead among all streamers and networks with 142 total nominations, well ahead of Netflix, with 120, and Apple TV+, with 81.

Some notable first-time nominees have entered the field of various acting categories this year, including big names like Javier Bardem (Netflix's *Monsters: The Lyle and Erik Menendez Story*), Kristen Bell (Netflix's *Nobody Wants This*), Colin Farrell (*The Penguin*), Harrison Ford (Apple TV+'s *Shrinking*) and Scott Glenn (*The White Lotus*).

Nominees for Outstanding Comedy Series are *Abbott Elementary* (ABC), *The Bear* (Hulu), *Hacks* (HBO Max), *Nobody Wants This*, *Only Murders in the Building* (Hulu), *Shrinking*, *The Studio* (Apple TV+) and *What We Do in the Shadows* (FX). Outstanding Drama Series nominees are *Andor* (Disney+), *The Diplomat* (Netflix), *The Last of Us* (HBO), *Paradise* (Hulu), *The Pitt* (HBO Max), *Severance*, *Slow Horses* (Apple TV+) and *The White Lotus*.

A Grammy Salute To Earth, Wind & Fire Live: The 21st Night Of September

2025 Video Music Awards

■ Sunday, Sept. 7

Long a staple on MTV alone, this year the VMAs are airing live on CBS for the first time in a three-hour ceremony that will also be simulcast on the show's OG network, which is a sister service within the CBS/Paramount family. An hourlong preshow will air across all the networks in that family. The race for most ever VMA wins continues between Beyoncé and Taylor Swift, both nominated for Artist of the Year.

■ **What's It All About?** Like death, taxes and jury duty, a trip to the Department of Motor Vehicles service center is a sad inevitability. It's the bane of bureaucracy, the reddest of red tape, the height of tedium and an excellent source of sardonic humor. Based on Katherine Heiny's short story "Chicken-Flavored and Lemon-Scented," this single-camera workplace comedy centers on a Los Angeles-area DMV center and the underpaid, underappreciated employees who hold dominion over that little plastic card that allows you to

exist. Goodhearted Colette (Harriet Dyer) is a driving examiner who genuinely cares for people and is therefore in the wrong job. Gregg (Tim Meadows) is a former English teacher who finds his DMV job relaxing by comparison. Ceci (Gigi Zumbado), the lavishly fingernailed photographer/laminator, enjoys the "constant rush of superiority." What Vic (Tony Cavalero) lacks in office decorum, he makes up for in abuse of authority. There's also the great unwashed, such as the elderly driver with diminished capacities, the guy whose van is also his home, the potential serial killer and the entitled jamoke who's above the rules. If nothing else, the show serves as a reminder to be nice to DMV employees. You might have to be there once every eight years. They have to be there Monday through Friday from 8am-5pm. — *Ryan A. Berenz*

■ From *30 Rock* creators Tina Fey and Robert Carlock comes this comedy series about disgraced former football player Reggie Dinkins (Tracy Morgan) and his mission to rehabilitate his image. Daniel Radcliffe plays a filmmaker who moves into Dinkins' mansion to film an immersive documentary about him. Erika Alexander, Bobby Moynihan, Precious Way and Jalyn Hall also star.

"We are excited that we get to tell our story and wrap it up, and we want to make sure our fans are pleased and they love it," star Cedric the Entertainer tells TV Insider. "We will have a lot of fun throughout Season 8 and hopefully lead you to a finale that feels worthy." A planned spinoff that would have followed Marty and Malcolm has been canceled.

■ **Who's In It?** Mark Ruffalo, Tom Pelphrey

■ **What's It All About?** Brad Ingelsby (writer of *Mare of Easttown*) returns to HBO and Philadelphia and takes us on a thrilling, complicated, emotionally rich journey following FBI agent Tom Brandis (Mark Ruffalo) and his team as they try to put an end to a string of violent robberies led by an unsuspecting family man (Tom Pelphrey) trying to provide for his family.

Ruffalo, who comes from a working-class upbringing, could empathize with his character and was attracted by how many parts of him were at war with himself. Tom struggles with God and faith in a world that gives no simple answers and only offers complex questions. He struggles with fatherhood and a broken family, along with alcoholism and mental health. Despite everything stacked against him, he believes in forgiveness, grace and that there is good in the human race, but it's not easy. We're desperately hoping he can find his way.

"There was one gesture that made me kind of fall in love with Tom," Ruffalo shares. "It was all his struggle, his sense of humor, his darkness, but when he swirls his big vodka drink with his finger or plunges his face in ice in the morning to deal with his hangover [which Ruffalo loved shooting] or drives his old reliable car, which is falling apart, these are the things that make him feel so real to me. I come from working-class people. As successful as I am, that is really how I understand the world."

When we first meet Tom, it's clear he's endured something tragic within his family. "We see him carrying a difficult weight, but it's invisible to us and because we see him carrying it, we want to know what it is," Ruffalo explains. "That is revealed beautifully and shockingly over time."

While Ingelsby's writing gives us a high-octane cop and robber story, it's also going to gut us. "It has all the action and heroism we want and need today but he will crack open your heart along the way and remind you about what is beautiful about being a human being: our love for our families, our innate decency, empathy, and the power of forgiveness, generosity and love. We are living through cruel times and it's hard to remember what truly good people sound like and act like. You will remember, and it will give you strength and comfort." — *Barb Oates*

■ **What's It All About?** There's nothing worse than a white man who cares. They're the saddest of the bunch. That's the thought of a few Tulsa folks when referring to Lee Raybon, a self-described "truthstorian."

Lee's an unconventional, and mostly reckless, citizen journalist.

"I read stuff. I research stuff. I drive around and I find stuff. Then — I write about stuff," he shares to one of the many people he ticks off along the way. "Some people care, some people don't. I'm chronically unemployed. Always broke. But let's just say, I am obsessed with the truth."

That truth-seeking obsession leads to plenty of trouble.

Ethan Hawke plays the mesmerizing oddball Lee and is an absolute tour de force in the role, which is easily among Hawke's best work, and that's with a resumé that includes unforgettable performances in *Dead Poets Society*,

Boyhood, *Gattaca*, *First Reformed* and the *Before* trilogy. The series was written and created by *Reservation Dogs*' Sterlin Harjo, and Hawke also joins Harjo as an executive producer.

Complicating Lee's insatiable obsession with the truth is the fact that he has a 14-year-old daughter (Ryan Kiera Armstrong) who he doesn't spend enough time with, an ex (Kaniehtiio Horn) who still sees some good in him, and an equally unusual employee at the bookstore he owns who only wants to know when she'll ever get paid. And then there's this mysterious stranger named Marty (Keith David), who seems to appear whenever Lee least expects it.

All of that leads to some playful banter and chaos.

Oh, and the last person Lee wrote about has turned up dead, and his really-not-grieving widow Betty Jo (*Big Love*'s Jeanne Tripplehorn) is more interested in her brother-in-law (Kyle MacLachlan), a gubernatorial candidate.

Buckle up for this bloody, wild, eight-episode, must-see noir, as Lee promises to "set off a flare, kick up the rocks and see what the roaches do at night." — *Barb Oates*

■ **Returns:** Sun., Oct. 19 at 8pm

■ **Where We Left Off:** Colter Shaw (Justin Hartley) finally returned to his childhood home of Echo Ridge to uncover a shocking truth about his father's death:

Otto Waldron (Alex Fernandez), a friend of Colter's father, confessed to pushing him off a cliff at the behest of Colter's mother (Wendy Crewson).

■ **What To Expect:** Obviously, the new information about his father's death left Colter reeling, and the implications of this knowledge

will have consequences going forward. Additionally, without Velma (Abby McEnany) and Teddi (Robin Weigert), who are both not returning, the show is missing about half of its regular cast, so there's a lot of room for new characters — as well as more time and space for attorney/legal counsel Reenie (Fiona Rene). After the Season 2 finale, showrunner Elwood Reid did tell us he was still putting together the pieces of the puzzle, the "biggest" of which was "figuring out the Reenie of it all, what Reenie's world looks like, and how the team fits around that."
