Kaos **ORIGINAL SERIES**

This dark comedy that turns Greek mythology on its head stars Jeff Goldblum as Zeus, king of the gods, a position he has enjoyed for quite some time. Then one day he discovers the unthinkable — a wrinkle on his forehead. Paranoia builds, leading the supreme deity down a dangerous and unstable path. Zeus is convinced his fall is nigh and sees omens of doom everywhere. And he's right to be worried, because Prometheus, Zeus' onetime friend and now prisoner, is orchestrating a plan to bring him down. The plan involves three disparate humans, all of whom are totally unaware of their cosmic significance or the part they must play in saving the world. As Zeus battles his greatest fears, the rest of his family is scheming and failing in their own ways, including his plotting wife, Hera (Janet McTeer); his complicated brothers, Hades (David Thewlis) and Poseidon (Cliff Curtis); and his rebellious son, Dionysus (Nabhaan Rizwan).

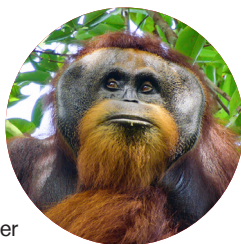

Mon Laferte, te Amo

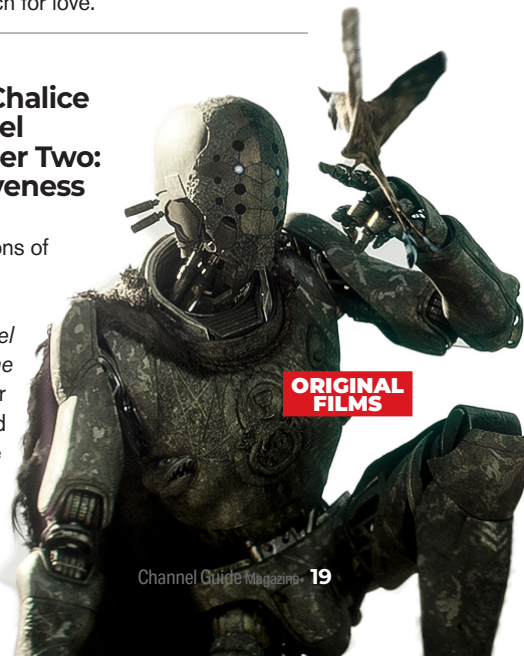

How that arm came to be severed and floating in the ocean is a mystery that compels Yancy to risk it all, which he must do in order to untangle the web of lies and various crimes surrounding the arm's origins. The unofficial case leads him to the Bahamas and down some unexpected avenues among a very eccentric group of characters, including medical examiner (and love interest) Rosa Campesino, played by Natalie Martinez.

"I think the whole tone of the show really is very creative and different," Martinez shares. "The fact that you have us going off on unofficial police work and the comedy that brings. It's the perfect balance. The way [showrunner Bill Lawrence] writes is truly amazing. And Vince is such a legend. He's so brilliant at what he does."

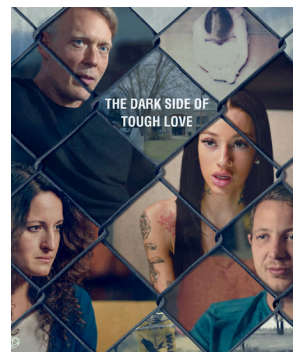

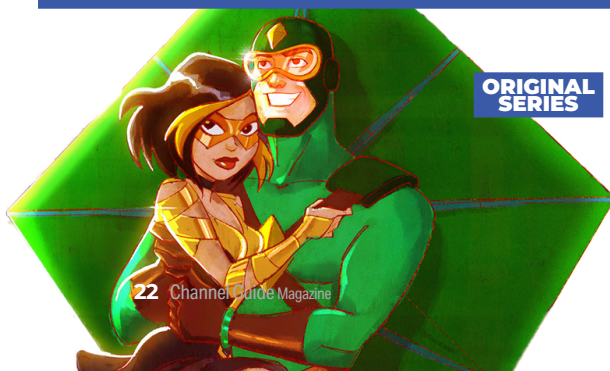


Kite Man: Hell Yeah!
