To pull this off, he enlists the help of some savvy criminals: Keila (Michelle Jenner), a cybersecurity mastermind; Damián (Tristán Ulloa), an academic and Berlin's close friend; Cameron (Begoña Vargas), a loose cannon who lives life on the edge; Roi (Julio Peña), a locksmith and Berlin's faithful sidekick; and Bruce (Joel Sánchez), who is fluent in gadgets and weaponry.



**Analog Squad

This film is a sequel to 2000's *Chicken Run*, the highest-grossing stop-motion animated film of all time. Having pulled off a death-defying escape from Tweedy's farm, Ginger (voice of Thandiwe Newton) has finally found her dream — a

peaceful island sanctuary for the whole flock, far from the dangers of the human world. When she and Rocky (Zachary Levi) hatch a little girl they name Molly (Bella Ramsey), Ginger's happy ending seems complete. But back on the mainland the whole of chicken-kind faces a new and terrible threat. For Ginger and her team, even if it means putting their own hard-won freedom at risk — this time, they're breaking in.



Rebel Moon — Part One: A Child of Fire

Zack Snyder (*Man of Steel*) cowrote and directed this epic science-fantasy event. When a peaceful settlement on a moon in the furthest reaches of the universe finds itself threatened by the armies of the tyrannical Regent Balisarius

(Fra Fee), Kora (Sofia Boutella), a mysterious stranger living among the villagers, becomes their best hope for survival. Tasked with finding trained fighters who will unite with her in making an impossible stand against the Motherworld, Kora assembles a small band of warriors — outsiders, insurgents, peasants and orphans of war — from different worlds who share a common need for redemption and revenge. As the shadow of an entire Realm bears down on the unlikely of moons, a new army of heroes is formed. Djimon Hounsou, Charlie Hunnam and Michiel Huisman also star.

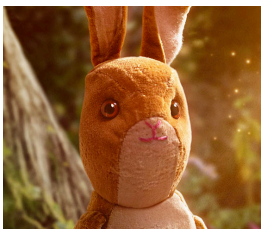
