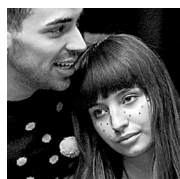


ORIGINAL FILMS

Available Feb. 12

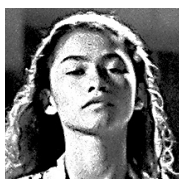

After discovering her seemingly innocent new client (Dianne Wiest) harbors dangerous secrets, Marla and her partner (Eiza González) come to find they have unknowingly triggered a battle with a ruthless adversary (Peter Dinklage).

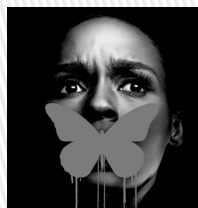

The six-episode first season of this Anna Paquin-led British dramedy, which first aired in America in 2019 on Pop TV, became available on the series' new home at Amazon Prime Video on Jan. 22, along with the announcement that Season 2 – another six episodes that aired last year in Britain but have not yet been seen in the States – will premiere on Amazon later this year.

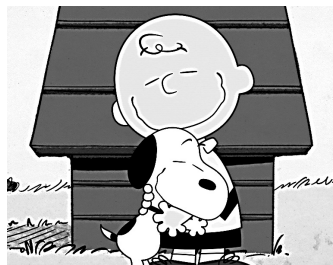

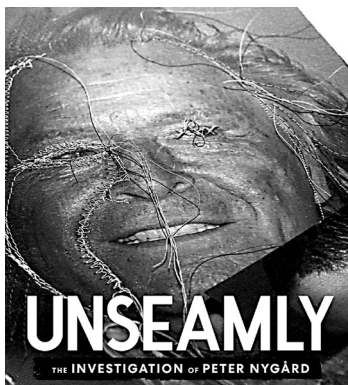

Unseamly: The Investigation of Peter Nygård

"You have to learn how to make money, you have to learn how to keep money and you have to learn how to spend money." These words are attributed to the fashion mogul you likely had never heard of

before his indictment on sex-trafficking charges in December – the Canadian "King of Polyester," Peter Nygård.

Nygård built an international fashion empire worth hundreds of millions of dollars and quickly learned how to spend the vast fortune he amassed. But hiding beneath the outlandish public persona, scores of women say, was a dangerous sexual predator who "practiced" and "perfected" the crime of sexual assault for decades. More than 80 women in the Bahamas, Canada and the United States have joined a class-action lawsuit accusing Nygård and his companies of rape, sexual assault and sex trafficking dating back to the 1970s. This four-episode docuseries (all four episodes drop on Feb. 12) takes a deeper look into these accusations and explores Nygård's life.

The Investigation

This six-part Scandinavian limited drama series comes from Oscar-nominated writer and director of *A War* and acclaimed director of *Mindhunter*, Tobias Lindholm. The series explores the complex real-life investigation surrounding the 2017 murder of Swedish journalist Kim Wall, which made international

headlines as one of the most notorious criminal cases in Danish media history. Based on the internationally followed "submarine case," the drama follows Jens Møller Jensen (Søren Malling), the head of homicide, and his team in the pursuit of the truth. With the hope of being able to provide the prosecutor (Pilou Asbæk, *Game of Thrones*) solid evidence in order to create a convincing case and give the relatives the certainty they deserve, the team enlists the use of methodical, unusual and technical work tactics.

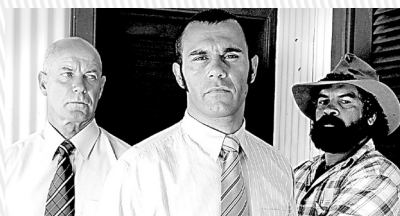
