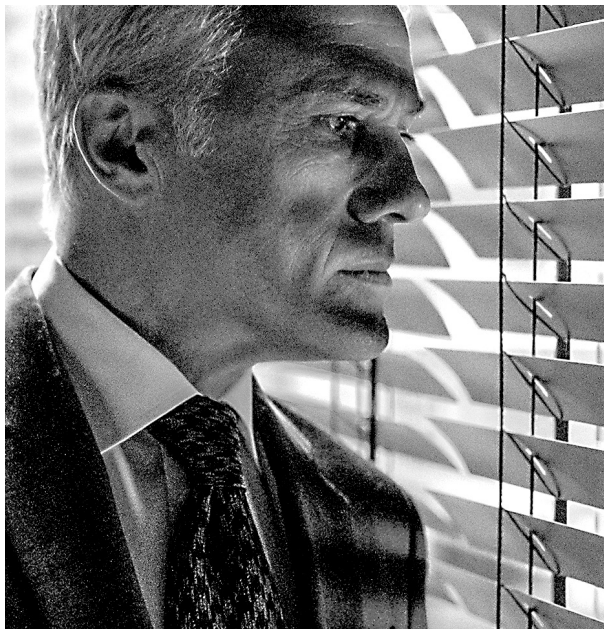

This blockbuster entry in the Marvel Cinematic Universe (MCU) makes its streaming debut. The story finds Queen Ramonda (Golden Globe winner Angela Bassett), Shuri (Letitia Wright), M'Baku (Winston Duke), Okoye (Danai Gurira) and the Dora Milaje (including Florence Kasumba's Ayo) fighting to protect their nation from intervening world powers in the wake of King T'Challa's death (Chadwick Boseman,

who portrayed T'Challa in *Black Panther* and other MCU titles, passed away in 2020). As the Wakandans strive to embrace their next chapter, the heroes must band together with the help of War Dog Nakia (Lupita Nyong'o) and Everett Ross (Martin Freeman), and forge a new path for the kingdom of Wakanda. The film introduces Tenoch Huerta Mejia as Namor, the ruler of a hidden undersea nation, and also stars Dominique Thorne, Michaela Coel, Mabel Cadena and Alex Livinalli.

The 1619 Project

This production from Disney's Onyx Collective is a six-part docuseries that expands upon the bestselling *The 1619 Project: A New Origin Story*, which was created by Pulitzer Prize-winning journalist Nikole Hannah-Jones and *The New York*

Times Magazine. In keeping with that original project, the series seeks to reframe our country's history by placing the consequences of slavery and the contributions of Black Americans at the center of the national narrative. Hannah-Jones hosts the series, whose episodes — "Democracy," "Race," "Music," "Capitalism," "Fear" and "Justice" — are adapted from essays in the written project and examine how the legacy of slavery shapes different aspects of contemporary American life.



Stolen Youth: Inside the Cult at Sarah Lawrence

All Three Episodes Available Feb. 9

With unprecedented access, this three-part docuseries excerpts striking firsthand interviews with con man Larry Ray's victims, and incorporates personal audio tapes and video recordings to tell the story of his grim, 10-year influence over a group of young people through an infamous sex cult he developed on the campus of Sarah Lawrence College in Yonkers, New York. The series follows the story of the cult's origins in 2010 to its recent demise, as the last members find their own paths to survival in the wake of Ray's 2022 conviction on charges including sex trafficking, extortion, forced labor and more (his sentencing was scheduled to occur on Jan. 20).

Following its limited theatrical release in December, this first narrative feature film from Disney's Onyx Collective makes its streaming debut. Director/cowriter Miles Warren's searing drama began as a 10-minute short of the same name that debuted at the 2021 Sundance Film

Festival, and is now a feature-length tale that expands its exploration of fathers, families and the effects of toxic masculinity. It follows 14-year-old Darius (Jalyn Hall), who explores the boundaries of his manhood through tumultuous interactions with Malcolm (Shamier Anderson), his strict but loving father, and Porter (Trevante Rhodes, also a producer), a charismatic drifter. When Darius learns Porter's true identity, he is thrust into a conflict between the two men that may rip his family apart and threaten his safety.

was the second African American female artist to win a Grammy Award for Best Contemporary Pop Vocal Performance ("Do You Know the Way to San Jose"). Still recording and touring, she also continues to use her voice to fight for humanitarian causes, civil rights, and HIV/AIDS awareness and compassion.
